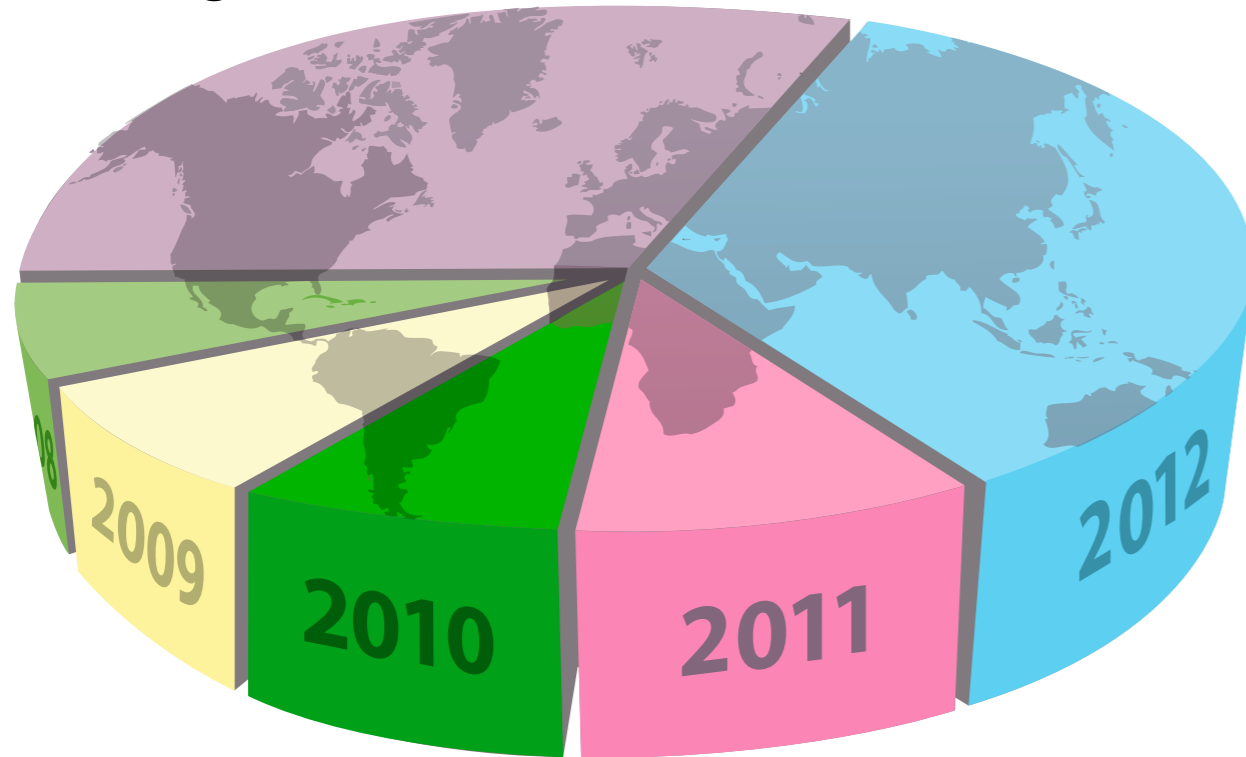


Social Value is a project carried out by the Trevi Group and aimed at promoting and supporting solidarity initiatives, mainly addressed to children, both at local, national and international level. Started at the beginning of 2008, the project gathers all the actions promoted and supported every year by the Trevi Group in the

territories where it works, through its companies scattered throughout the five continents. Besides the projects directly managed by the Management of Cesena (Italy), a number of local initiatives involve the Group's subsidiaries based abroad. The common thread of all Social Value activities is helping the youngest,

most vulnerable and marginalized pockets of the population. Shelter, support and aid actions, as well as targeted interventions to empower disadvantaged children through education.

In the first years of activity, Social Value has carried out more than 50 solidarity projects at local, national and international level.

Highly committed to the core values underpinning its activity since the very beginning, to be fully and perfectly integrated in the local realities where it works, the Trevi Group has always been working to provide help and support in difficult situations.

The Trevi Group has donated a complete system for groundwater exploration and exploitation to two humanitarian associations working in Central Africa to fight against drought. The said associations are AVSI from Cesena, which operates in South Sudan and "Africa Mission - Cooperazione e Sviluppo" from Piacenza that has an operating base in Uganda.

The African regions of Sudan and Uganda are indeed affected by the serious problem of the lack of water, which has dramatic consequences also on the health of the population. Committed in a number of international solidarity projects, the Trevi Group has donated a plant for water exploration and exploitation in favour of the project "Water for life". The plant can reach a depth of 150 m

and includes a number of technical support equipment, two compressors, drilling accessories and five 4-wheel drive trucks (2 trucks equipped with a tank for water collection and transport, 2 fully equipped trucks for the provision of various services and 1 fitted with a hydraulic crane). In addition to the donation of the

equipment, skilled workers of the Trevi Group will train the staff onsite on how to use and service the whole system. It is a significant aid to the initiative carried out by the two humanitarian associations committed to the social, health and economic development of extremely poor areas of the world.

there throughout their development and empowerment through an education and training project.

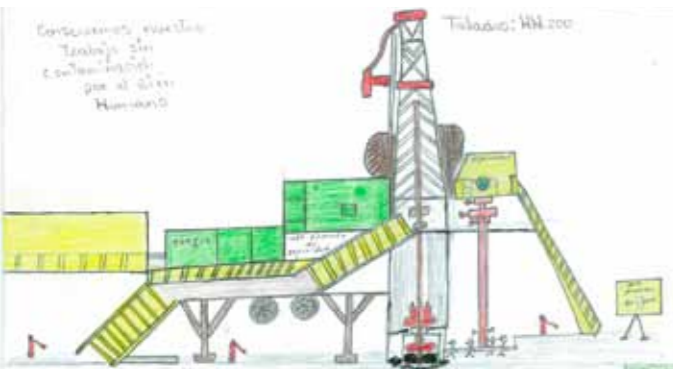
At present the Mariella's Children Home hosts 90 children belonging to the poorest classes.

Since 2003 Petreven – a company of the Trevi Group specialised in oil drilling services – has been organising every year the Kid Drawing Contest, at its subsidiaries. The contest is open to all the children of Petreven employees working in Argentina, Colombia, Peru, Chile and Venezuela. On average, more than 200 children aged 3 to 14 years take part in the contest, after experiencing their parents' workplace for one full day; they are asked to creatively interpret themes associated with safety, prevention and environ-

ment protection. The project is aimed at raising awareness among adults and children alike. Indeed children, with their drawings, convey the importance of health and safety of people at the workplace, in order to protect the environment in which they live. The drawings are gathered and included in the Diary and Calendar of the companies of the following year, whereas children are given educational materials.

Answering to the need expressed by the Congregação das Irmãs Franciscanas Hospitaleiras da Imaculada Conceição, Profuro International Ltd – subsidiary of the Trevi Group in Mozambique – has built and donated a turnkey drinking water well to the children community of “4 de Outubro” in the district of Marracuene, within the province of Maputo.

The project has been funded by the Trevi Group and the Rotary Club of Cosenza Nord in Italy, belonging to the Rotary International District 2100.

“Colora l’energia” (Colouring energy) is a graphic art competition on sustainability addressed to pupils and students of some primary, secondary and high schools. A special jury selected 50 out of the 700 works submitted to realize a permanent exhibition along the sidewalk bordering the jobsite of the new Caps car park. Promoted by Social Value, the initiative has involved a number of

schools in Cesena.

With the aim of raising awareness among young people on hot topics such as sustainability, the project saw the participation of more than 800 boys and girls aged from 6 to 16.

Thanks to the involvement of teachers and parents alike, the young students firstly worked on the concept of renewable energy, by analysing the main sources (solar, wind, geothermal),

and were asked to write down their thoughts, slogans and suggestions on differently sized cards.

More than 700 works were made using the most varied techniques. Some of the works were selected by a special jury to be part of a permanent exhibition "along the sidewalk" bordering the Caps jobsite of Cesena; they will be on display for at least one year. It was not an easy task for the special Jury made up of Sculptor

Leonardo Lucchi, writer Alessandro Savelli and the Councillor of Culture Daniele Galdi to select roughly 50 works to display at the exhibition "Colora l'Energia".

Social Value has joined and funded the project implemented by the Rotary Club in Cesena which is meant to prevent alcohol consumption by teenagers.

The initiative named "Che piacere..." (What a pleasure...) was launched following the publication of data on alcohol consumption by teenagers by the National Health Institute. The said data reveals worrying trends: as soon as the age of eleven years, one boy

out of five and one girl out of ten drink alcoholic beverages regularly and the average age of getting drunk for the first time has dropped to fourteen years.

Concerned by this problem, the Rotary Club in Cesena has launched and promoted the campaign "Che piacere..." involving the secondary and high schools of the town, with the aim of informing and raising awareness among new generations

– and not only them – about the problems associated with alcohol consumption.

The project is run by a group of specialised psychologists and includes four stages: an action addressed to teachers and students aimed at avoiding irreversible damage to brain caused by alcohol consumption by teenagers; a second action informing against misleading advertising on alcohol beverages that propose a positive, uninhibited model prone to

socialisation; a third action targeting parents in order to propose rules and limits to alcohol consumption by teenagers; and a fourth action addressed to the whole society to encourage it to take on a responsible attitude on this issue from a cultural point of view.

Social Value has decided to join this initiative, thus confirming its strong support to projects mainly addressed to young people and contributing to their cultural and social development.

The Trevi Group has actively participated in the project implemented by the Province of Varese to help the population hit by the earthquake, namely to restore calm and tranquillity among children. The project involved the construction of two pre-schools, one in Pizzoli d'Aquila and one in Goriano Sicoli. The pre-school inauguration was a big event for children, teachers and parents (see the photo at bottom, on the right-hand side).

Two prefabricated homes and two offices have been supplied by the Trevi Group to the people and institutions dealing with the aftermath of the earthquake in Abruzzo. The first prefabricated module has been placed in the town of L'Aquila to host the office of the President of the Province of L'Aquila, whereas the second office has been used by the Commissariat of the Italian Red Cross. The other two prefabricated homes have been given to the police.

“Water for life”: 176 wells are up and running.

The project “Water for life” continues intensely. The project sees the participation of the Trevi Group, the Opera di Don Vittorione “Africa Mission – Cooperazione e Sviluppo di Piacenza” and some local catholic dioceses in Sudan and Uganda. The project is aimed to tackle the lack of water which has been affecting large regions in Africa since many years.

Encouraging results have been obtained by the end of 2010: 174 new wells were drilled (125 within the province of Karamoja in Uganda and 49 in the South of Sudan), 180 abandoned wells were restored to working conditions, 40 drinking

troughs for the cattle were built. Moreover locals were educated on the correct use of water and ordinary maintenance to the water pumps; local mechanics were trained and committees were set up to ensure the sustainability of the newly built wells over time. As a whole these interventions benefited more than 400,000 people.

Furthermore, by restoring the aqueduct in Moroto, drinking water was made available to the inhabitants of the town and the surrounding areas, directly benefiting 12,000 people.

Thanks to the co-funding by Unicef, some 33 new wells were drilled close to as many schools in Karamoja, namely 14 in the districts of Kaabong and Kotido and 19 in the districts of Nakapiripirit and Abim. A number of education activities on health and hygiene were also carried out in 15 schools in the districts of Kaabong and Kotido, mobilising and raising awareness among students, groups, teachers, school staff, community members and local leaders. In schools, 30 drinking water taps were installed. The said interventions directly benefited more than 170,000 people – students and

school staff. Indirect beneficiaries were the students' families and the whole community. The project also involves the restoration of the existing wells that do not work at present, the setting up of a village committee responsible for properly servicing the well and raising awareness among the local community on hygiene and health issues resulting from the use of non-potable water.

The project of building a nutrition centre in Cité Soleil has become a reality!

The initiative has been fully funded by the Trevi Group which in 2011 launched an in-house fund-raising to which many employees took part both in Italy and abroad.

The project completed and inaugurated in the first months of 2012, included two separate stages:
1. The construction of the Nutrition Centre covering a surface of 160

sq.m. and rehabilitation of the surrounding soil. The land selected for the Centre is in the main square of the neighbourhood of Cité Soleil. The Municipality Cité Soleil gave the usufruct on the land for the provision of services to the public to the volunteers' association AVSI of Cesena which has been working since many years on site to provide educational

services and nutrition support. 2. The construction and start-up of a "Water point" with restrooms, water storage and chlorination tanks, taps for water supply to the community. The water point can store 1,600 litres of water and ensure a minimum standard in emergency situations (2l of drinking water per person per day) for 3,200 people, or the supply needed

for about 1,000 people (7l of water per person per day).

The Trevi Group will pay for the operating costs of the centre for at least the next two years.

Pilotes Trevi has always been committed to supporting the most disadvantaged people, and especially the children. In 2011 they funded two projects: the construction of a stable for horse therapy (equine-assisted therapy) and an infants school specially dedicated to the nutrition of children.

2012 **Italy, a concrete aid to the populations hit by earthquake in Emilia**

Workers, employees and managers of the Trevi Group both in Italy and abroad have joined the initiative to donate part of their wages in the framework of "A concrete aid to the populations hit by earthquake in Emilia".

The collected money was doubled by Social Value and used to buy last-generation reusable tents fitted with air-conditioning. The tents were donated to the Cesena section of Croce Verde that identified the small town of Mirandola, in the Province of Modena, as one of the places most severely affected by the earthquake and having extremely urgent needs. A delegation of the Trevi Group went to Mirandola to deliver the tents directly to the municipal administration.

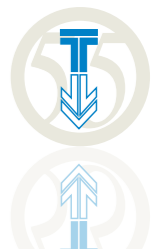
