Trevi for the 37 Km Causeway in Kuwait

Trevi Foundations Kuwait, branch of Trevi Group, is involved in the construction of the Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah Causeway Project. The project is located in the Middle East and in particular in Kuwait, Kuwait city. The project is a 37-km causeway across the Bay of Kuwait, connecting Shuwaikh Port with Subiya New Town Development. The project also includes a 27 km low-level bridge across the bay, a main bridge with a span of 200 meters, elevated road, and a 5 km approach road onshore in Subiya. The causeway, to be named after late emir Sheikh Jaber al-Ahmad alSabah. is to link the capital Kuwait City with the northern Subiya area, which is to become home to the Silk City project. Is a mega construction project, will also include 2 man-made islands of 30 hectares. For a safety and functional bridge is necessary a safety foundation. In this project more than 1,200 piles are requested. For Trevi Foundation Kuwait



(sub-contractor for this project) about 760 piles given by two main contractors: 540 piles by **Hyundai Engineering & Construction Co. Ltd.**, and 220 piles by **Combine group Contracting Co**.

Due to the characteristics of the soil, the best choice, thanks to the possibility to drill in any type of soil or rock, until a depth of about 100 meters, bored pile technology was adopted.
